

## **Babes With Bullets™ Ladies Action Shooting Camp (PH101)**

**DATE:** September 22-24, 2010

**PLACE:** Bend of the River Conservation Club

**AIRPORT:** The nearest airport is South Bend Regional Airport.

**LODGING:** Your registration fee covers GROUP lodging. We normally stay in a lodge or series of condos located near the range. Our group lodging is generally "bunkhouse" style with six to eight ladies sharing a cabin or condominium. Those who choose to utilize the group lodging often must share a bed or in some cases sleep on an air mattress. If you choose to make other lodging arrangements we should be able to recommend a nearby hotel. The cost of camp remains the same even if you don't utilize the group lodging. We strongly encourage campers, even those who are local to the area, to spend the evenings with the group.

**FOOD:** Our camp cook makes most of the lunch and dinner food purchases before you arrive but we will do some shopping after we have conferred with all campers. We will make sandwiches or wraps for lunch at the range each day. Each evening we will gather at one of the condominiums for dinner and to discuss the next day's activities.

The ladies in each condominium will see to their own breakfast needs. I suggest you wait to meet with your housemates to determine what breakfast items you may need so that you don't end up with multiple purchases of the larger staples such as bread, milk and cereal.

We will have water coolers at the range. You will be responsible for purchasing your own beverages such as soft drinks, sports drinks and alcoholic beverages.

**ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES:** Needless to say, guns and alcohol don't mix! You are welcomed to enjoy an alcoholic beverage in the afternoon or evening after all shooting has ceased. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages are allowed on the range premises.

**CAMP DESCRIPTION:** The Babes With Bullets PH101 Camp is geared toward the novice shooter and is appropriate for ladies that have *never* handled a handgun, up to ladies that are currently competing in Practical Pistol matches at the "C" or "D" class level. (Read, "Which camp is right for you".) On the first day of camp participants will be segregated according to skill level. Those ladies that have very little shooting experience will begin shooting with a .22 caliber pistol. The more experienced shooters will start their day shooting the 9mm loaner guns

or their own center-fire pistols. On the third day of camp all campers will participate in the Babes With Bullets™ “mini” match.

**COST:** \$650 for USPSA members, \$675 for non-USPSA members. (The extra \$25 will be spent to sign campers up for a one year USPSA membership. [www.uspsa.org](http://www.uspsa.org)) Cost includes two and ½ days of instruction, participation in a Practical Pistol match, and group lodging.

**EQUIPMENT:** Handgun suitable for Practical Pistol competition. Holster and magazine pouches along with competition style belt. 400 rounds of ammunition.

Loaner equipment is available to those ladies that do not have the appropriate handgun, holster, or magazine pouches. Our loaner handguns are Smith & Wesson M&P 9mm pistols. We also have BladeTech and Safariland holsters and magazine pouches for these pistols.

Campers will need a tactical belt, which comes in 1.25” or 1.5” width. These belts are available at many gun stores, Sportsman’s Warehouse, Cabella’s, and stores that sell police gear. They are also available online through supplies like Brownell’s or Dillon. Make sure the pants loops you bring can accommodate a big belt. Campers will also need to provide their own eye and ear protection. These items can be purchased at any sporting goods store or many discount stores such as Walmart. Ear protection can be either plugs or muffs. Your prescription glasses or a pair of sunglasses are fine for eye protection. (They don’t necessarily have to be “shooting” glasses.)

9mm ammunition will be available for purchase at the range.

**REGISTRATION & PAYMENT USING THE SHOPPING CART:** If you register and pay online with your VISA, MasterCard, or Discover card full payment is required. If you prefer to pay by check or money order chose the “check or money order” payment option and mail a copy of your invoice with payment. If paying by check or money order you may choose to send in a 50% deposit to reserve a spot in camp. Full payment is due 60 days before the start of camp.

**Refund Policy:** Full refunds are available with 60 days cancellation notice. Cancellation notices received after the 60 day deadline will receive a full refund only if the vacated spot can be filled.
